



## PRINCIPLES OF END-USER REDISTRIBUTION RIGHTS

- AltaLIS Ltd., Alberta Data Partnerships (ADP) and their partners always retain ownership and copyright to the basemap data.
- The license and use of extractable AltaLIS datasets in their original or value-added format remain with the licensed end user. It is the end user's responsibility to ensure that there is no unauthorized use of the licensed data by others.
- Redistribution of an extractable format is prohibited except as provided below:
  - Redistribution of both extractable and non-extractable data is permitted with any other end-user who has an ADP / AltaLIS subscription license for the defined area.
  - Third party contractors are permitted to work with extractable datasets on behalf of the licensed end user upon completion of Schedule 'B' of the end user license, the Written Undertaking.
- A third party contractor is not permitted to use extractable data supplied by an end user for another project. If a contractor provides a service for another client, that client must purchase the data and attain their own end user License.
- Redistribution of a non-extractable format is permitted for documents or reports, created as part of an organization's normal course of business.
- Redistribution of a non-extractable format for profit is prohibited unless an appropriate VASP agreement is signed.
- Limited redistribution in non-extractable format is permitted when the normal course of business is to provide specific information to the general public (excludes commercial advertising)

## DEFINITIONS

**Extractable** means a data format which allows the vector data to be exported into a CAD or GIS system which allows the manipulation of the attribute data and/or positional data.

**Non-Extractable** means a data format which does not allow translation of vector data into another format (examples are hardcopy, raster data, and view only).

**End-user** means an ADP / AltaLIS customer who has purchased the right to use base map data for their internal purposes. This right can be purchased by the geographic area by subscription or by transaction.

**A Written Undertaking** (Third Party Agreement) is a document which the end user has its contractor sign to use extractable digital data for the purposes of supporting the end user's normal course of business.
